SPRING BLOOM MATCHUP

Family Activity



LEARNING OBJECTIVE

To be able to identify common spring blooming plants by name, picture and "fun fact".

MATERIALS NEEDED

Pen Scissor (optional) Glue Stick (optional)

ACTIVITY

This activity can be either a worksheet activity, or a cut and paste matching activity. Younger family members can match the photos while older family numbers can help name the plants. Together, research the "fun facts" and see if you can identify what plant it belongs to.

- 1. Match picture of plant with that of it's close-up.
- 2. Match name of plant to picture.
- 3. Match "fun facts" to each plant.

ANSWER KEY

1.	Mayapple	Can be foraged for food, high in vitamins A and C. Can be used to make a tea to ward off colds and respitory conditions.
2.	Wild Violet	Part of the lily family. Name derived from Persian word that means turban.

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3.	English Ivy	Part of the dogbane family. The leaves are evergreen.
4.	Lambs Ears	A creeping perennial weed. Not only germinated by seed but can also produce new root systems from nodes.
5.	Forsythia	May be either evergreen or deciduous.
6.	Mountain Fire	Member of the bean family native to North America.
7.	Dandelion	Seldom encounters disease and pests. Grows well in shade, under trees and in poor or acidic soil.

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8.	Pachysandra	Slow growing evergreen also known as Japanese Andromeda.
9.	Rhododendron	The entire plant, apart from the ripe yellow fruit, is deadly toxic. Also known as ground lemon.
10.	Tulip	In the olive family, native to the Balken peninsula.
11.	Bleeding Heart	Drought tolerant and deer resistant. Native to Turkey, Armenia and Iran.
12.	Vinca Minor	Highly fragrant and blooms in dense clusters. Derived from the Greek word hyakinthos.

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13.	Hyacinth	This plant has 11 species, mostly native to Asia and is also known as "Easter Tree".
14.	Lilac Bud	The English name is a corruption of the French name meaning lion's tooth.
15.	Speedwell	Perennial classified as Narcisseae.
16.	Daffodil	When dense and mature, can destroy habitat for native wildlife and prohibit the growth of other plants.
17.	Redbud	Native to Asia, part of the poppy family.

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
